### **Carmel Heights Redevelopment Resubmission**

Finally, after more than one year, Micor has resubmitted their proposal for the redevelopment of the Carmel Heights property. Sadly, at first blush there does not appear to be any material changes in the site plan from their last proposal in February 2020.

The developer's hope is still clearly to build two 5-storey buildings and expect to have an entrance/exit off of Dundas Street. Both remain severe sticking points with our neighbourhood, city council and the Carmel Heights Redevelopment Committee (CHRC), who is representing our collective interests in this matter.

The CHRC will be meeting with Matt Mahoney to discuss our concerns and prepare a formal response. And we will continue to keep you informed of any further developments in the meantime.
