The Carmel Heights Redevelopment Committee (CHRC) invites all Sherwood Forrest residents to a Neighbourhood Zoom Meeting to update everyone on the status of the Carmel Heights redevelopment proposal.

The CHRC, on behalf of Sherwood Forrest residents, continues to oppose the rezoning application by Micor Developments that would permit the massive redevelopment of Carmel Heights.

The CHRC welcomes the renewal of Carmel Heights as a seniors' residence, but believes it should reflect the property's unique characteristics: very limited access routes, long and narrow dimensions and the fact that it is nestled within an established residential neighbourhood.

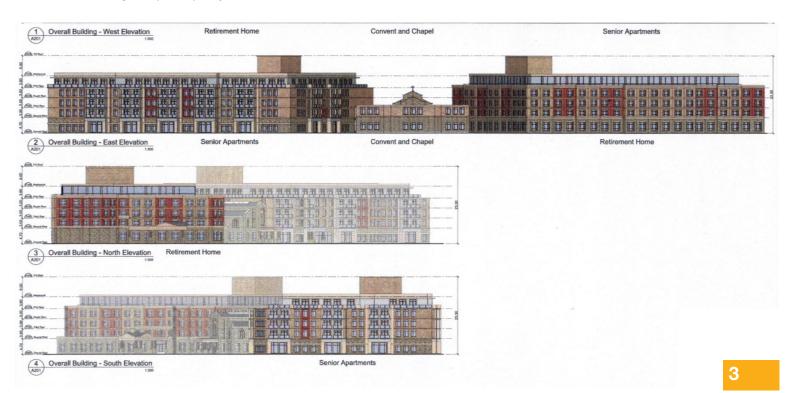
The revised application to The City of Mississauga ignores these factors. It currently includes two 5-storey buildings, a 2-storey convent (285 total units) and a large chapel (capacity unknown).

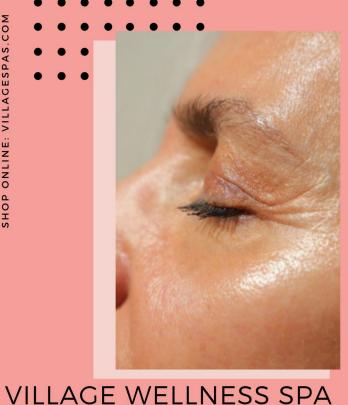
Ingredients: 2 Gala apples, 1 package of tri-coloured coleslaw, 1/3 cup sliced almonds, 1/3 cup dried cranberries, 1/3 cup light mayonnaise, 1/3 cup coleslaw dressing.

Chop apples into small cubes and combine all ingredients in a large bowl.

BBQ Skewers The trick to a perfectly cooked skewer is grilling them on a perforated foil tray. This method allows the food to cook evenly without burning. Many grocery stores sell pre-seasoned skewers. In this case all you need to do is spray your pan and place on the BBQ. Flip every 5 to 7 minutes.



For a delicious and light homemade marinade, try this Greek style dressing. Ingredients: 1 fresh lemon juiced, 1 tsp minced garlic, 1/4 cup white wine, 2 tbsp olive oil, fresh thyme, oregano, and rosemary, salt and pepper to taste. Mix all the ingredients together in a freezer bag and let the skewers marinate for several hours. **Enjoy!**

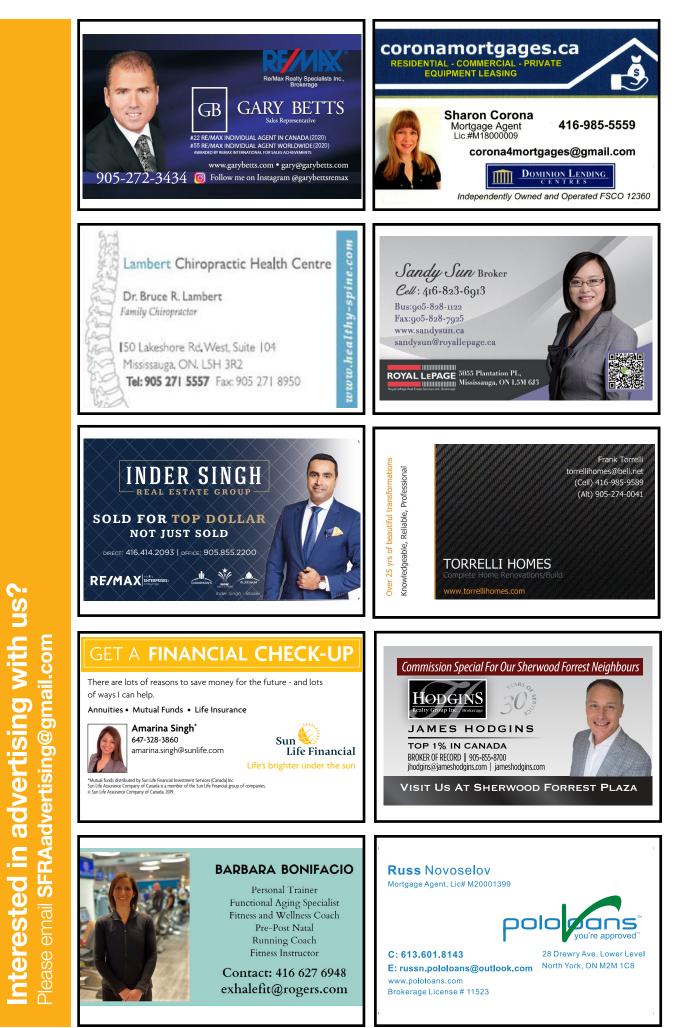
